BIBLIOGRAPHY

Most of the experiments described in this book have been submitted by one or more contributors. The editors have, in addition, consulted freely more than two dozen textbooks in high-school and college physics for suggestions and have referred to a number of the books in the following list. The books by the authors whose names are marked with an asterisk are based upon Christmas lectures delivered at the Royal Institution of Great Britain. They are suggested both for their content of experiments and as examples of scientific exposition.

The American Physics Teacher has been a fruitful source of ideas. Nearly 100 demonstration experiments have been described in the first five volumes of this journal since its inception in 1933, and the annual number is increasing rather than decreasing. *School Science and Mathematics* is likewise a valuable source of ideas on lecture and laboratory technique.

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
